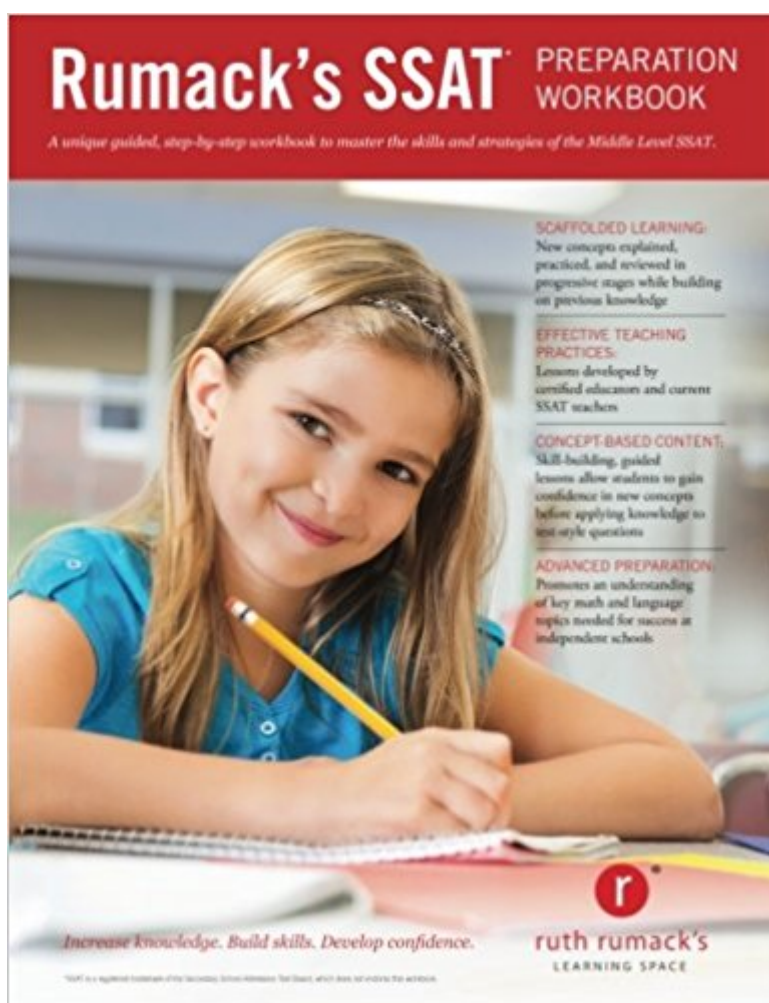

I tutor students for the SSAT, and this book is incredibly thorough. The math section gives lots of examples and explanations as well as drills in new concepts. It gives explanations of how to apply algebra to solve more complex word problems, which a lot of students struggle with. I would say this book is relevant for much of the upper level math as well. The best part about the analogies is the "common analogy types." Really helpful. Working with a student, I would have them try to create a bridge sentence that can be used for each of the common analogy types mentioned. The writing section teaches a lot of concepts that will improve kids' writing skills overall, not just test-day tricks. This is a great book to use in combination with practice tests, and parents will find it helpful for working through math concepts at home.

Lots of math practice! This book seems to differ from others in the amount of instruction/lessons before the practice questions. The analogy practice has been more in-depth than most others, and common analogy types are very helpful.

My daughter is writing the SSAT, so I bought this for the number of practice questions. I was pleased that she actually learned about creative writing elements too, along with the test content and strategies. Would be nice if it had full-length practice tests, but we used the official guides for this.

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
