

The story of James Smith, a sixteen year old English boy is compelling. He was snatched by Mohawks when out clearing trees near his colonial settlement. The dangers James and his family lived with were many. This was the time of the French and Indian War, when native Indians and the French warred against the British. The colony in the wilds of western Pennsylvania struggled daily against the elements and the wildlife, as well. James was very brave and learned many survival skills from his Indian "brother" and other tribal members. These skills helped James survive as he walked his way home for a year.
