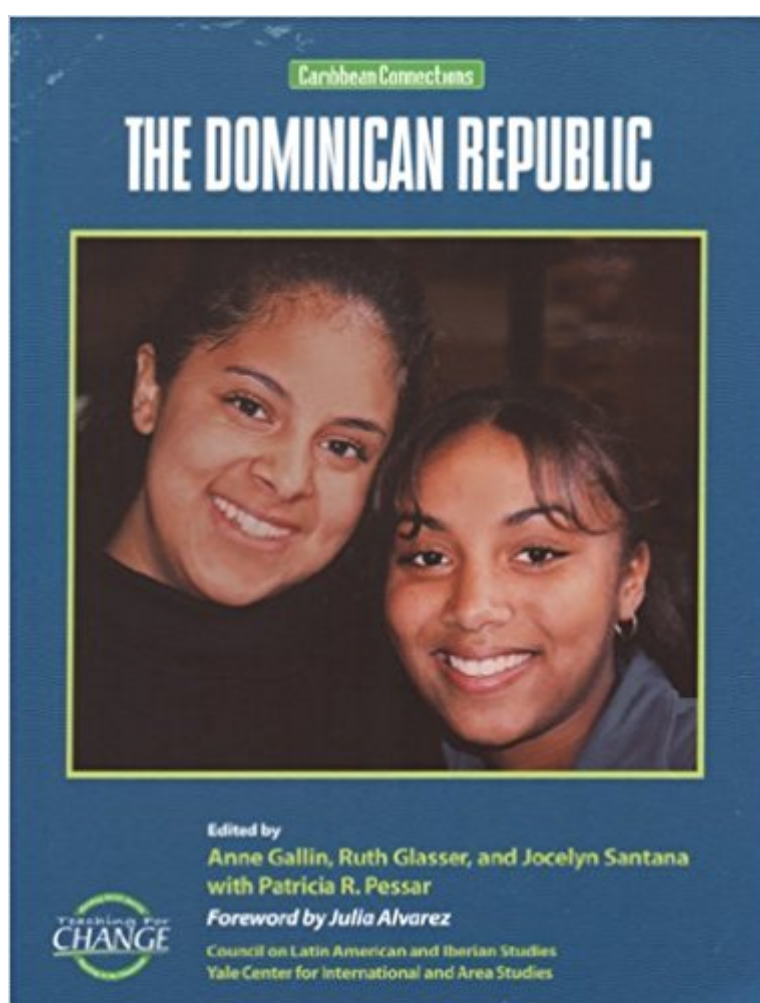


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Caribbean Connections: The Dominican Republic (Caribbean Connections: Classroom Resources For Secondary Sch)
