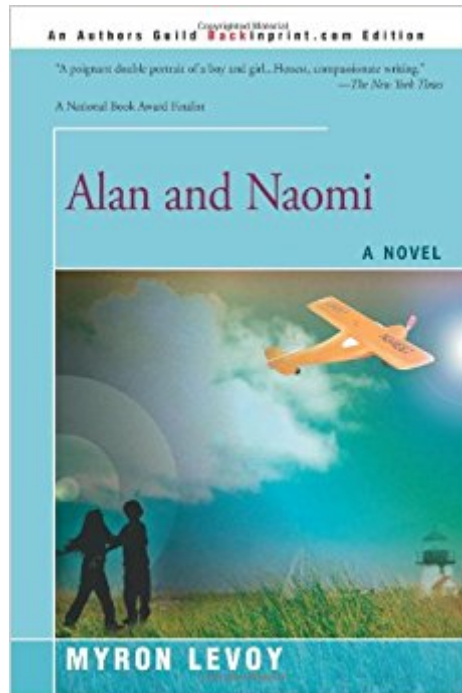

It was just okay. I had to read it for my Narrating Childhood class. It was short and easy to read.

Stories should change a person. At a minimum, they should make the reader feel something. Otherwise, both the author and the reader have wasted their time. This little book will definitely leave a mark. I'm not sure about the word count, but it's close to the threshold of novel and novelette. Either way, it's about mixed neighborhoods and PTSD, masculinity, friendship, tenderness, adolescence, and the long, ugly fingers of war. Most remarkable is Levoy's portrayal of conflicted emotions, and how we don't show what we feel or act in ways that make sense. Alan's youthful insecurity is palpable and immediately identifiable, an experience shared across generations. Others have recommended hiding this from younger readers, as the subject matter is

emotionally intense and difficult to handle. Discretion is always encouraged, but I respectfully propose that twelve, the age of the protagonist, is an appropriate age for most.
