

My son is a HUGE fan of Troy Cummings and the Notebook of Doom series. They are hard to find as I have only seen them sold at his school book fairs once a year. They are also \$5 a piece so I enjoyed the little bit of a discount that I got. These are great mystery style chapter books for beginners. They really engage the reader which is important for a young child. They aren't too big as to discourage them from wanting to read yet they aren't too childish either. I highly recommend the Notebook of Doom series for any child that likes to read fiction books about monsters and monster fighters.
