Kat Vespucci dives head first and unprepared into a very different culture: the island of Taiwan. And it's great fun to be inside the head of this intrepid traveler, like globe-trotting Alice finding herself in a weird and wacky Wonderland, every day a kaleidoscopic roller-coaster ride through a strange culture with its own rules and rituals. Having lived in Taiwan myself, it's fun to re-live the disorientation and discovery of the island through Kat Vespucci's eyes. And she's packed all of the experience into this novel: the dazzling variety of food, the traffic, the smells, the sounds, the politics, the threat of raw nature in earthquakes, typhoons, tropical diseases, and of course the fascinating hybrid culture, partly Chinese, partly Taiwanese (or "Tainese", as she comes to call it),

partly aboriginal, and partly a global mishmash of Western movies, 7-Elevens and Chinglish. And of course, romance, love, and, yes, sex -- plenty of it, in fact, but intermingled with humor, cross-cultural mixed messages, and strange twists of fate. And along the way, we also learn a lot about Chinese history, politics, and language. This is a great book for anyone who has been to Taiwan, or is thinking of going there, but it is also a wonderful reverie on the experience of travel itself, on what it's like to struggle with identity and culture in any new cultural context. It's a novel replete with both open-ended questions and satisfying epiphanies. There are also some great, hilarious scenes of unexpected "cultural" clashes, such as a broken-hearted, drunk Kat trying to find solace and camaraderie with a couple of Mormon missionaries. So if you like a mixture of serious sociology, silly puns, and sensuous abandon, this would be a good book to take on the plane with you.

While planning my trip to Taiwan to visit my son and his wife who teach English there, I learned of a newly released work by Ingrid Anders. It is about her adventures teaching English in Taiwan. Perfect! I downloaded it on the Kindle app for my iPad and waited for just the right moment to crack it open and learn a bit about the country I was about to visit. It was a great plane read; funny, and the pages and the time just flew by. The author has a knack for capturing the essence of the country and its culture in her vivid descriptions of her adventures. My son had meticulously planned our visit with him so that I would get to know Taiwan as much as possible in a short time but he could have just used Kat Vespucci as a travel guide! By the time I arrived I already knew about the BYOTP- be sure not to flush!, Night Market foods, massaging shampoos, mineral springs and more. It was a delight to experience what I had just read about. Buy this book and enjoy Kat's adventures, but be prepared - you will not want it to end! Where in the world will Kat land next? Can't wait!

I'm an expat teacher in Taiwan, and to be fair, I didn't make it that far into the book because I just couldn't relate to Kat Vespucci. She's really a light weight. I'm not saying that you don't experience culture shock and weirdness, but she lost me when she kept on fishing toilet paper out of the toilet (just flush it, you're not supposed to, but we all forget sometimes) with her roommate's chopsticks (seriously, you're worried about a little paper getting into the sewer but you're willing to dip your roommates eating utensils into your #1s and #2s?). When she spit out the not-quite-right bagel with whipped cream on it, I just stopped reading. We put up with weird food, culture shock, cultural misunderstandings, but Kat Vespucci is too lame for me to relate to or root for.

Anders has an amazing gift for describing places and situations. And a wonderful sense of humor. You feel the experiences Kat has and the places she visits. When Kat is in Taiwan, the reader is there with her. As when she was in Berlin. My only wish is that Kat would grow up! For all her worldly experiences, Kat is too naive. Looking forward to a grown up Kat in a new situation. Anders' writing just gets better and better.

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
