And what a day it is: hordes of children with all their feelings, mess, noise, new concepts, and even a fire alarm (which the school finds deeply embarrassing). Worried but curious, impetuous, and vulnerable, the school works as a perfect proxy for nervous child readers. Rex's warm and goofy text is brought to life by Robinson's vivid collage illustrations. His signature round-headed, tulip-handed figures are diverse and appealing, from the supportive janitor to the "little girl with freckles" who slowly warms up to school at the same time that the school is warming up to the children. **VERDICT A+:** an essential purchase that is simultaneously funny, frank, and

Bought this for my 4 year old granddaughter who absolutely loved it. The reversal of viewing the first day from the school's point of view is quirky and fun.

School's First Day of School is a charming, entertaining, and ultimately soothing look at that nerve wracking first day of school. The perspective is certainly unique and the sentiments are comforting without being too sweet. The text has a wonderfully smooth, read aloud flow as Rex looks at the first day of school through the eyes of the school itself. The author throws in just enough jokes to make sure things never get too serious and enough poignant moments to make sure every child listening to the story can relate to not only the children attending class that first day but also to the school itself, who is not too sure it likes all these children invading its spaces. There are children who are excited about school, and children who don't like school at all. There are confused children, sad children, and many children who are just trying to figure out what's what - just like the school. The school is terribly embarrassed by the fire drill and looks on with wonder at the kids climbing on the jungle gym. ("So that's what that is for") After a few bumpy disagreements, the school decides that it wants the children to come back the next day, just as many of the children decide the same thing. The school and the students take a journey together and learn they each have a lot to offer the

other. The simple illustrations perfectly complement the calm, understated text. The artist doesn't make the school too cartoony, instead giving it just the bare hint of a face. The characters are all expressive and the illustrations pop against the stark white background. Above all, school is portrayed as a safe, even whimsical place filled with fun and learning. These illustrations add to the book's rather old fashioned feel, with little touches that will make sure kids spend time re-reading the story. This is a sometimes subtle and always entertaining look at going to school that will be a perfect fit for any young student just starting kindergarten. An excellent gift for new students and a must have for classroom collections.

My kindergarten class enjoyed it and I was surprised at how many of my young students were able to understand the perspective of the school character in this story. I know I will pull this book out later in the school year to teach other skills.
