

Pilgrimage: My Search For The Real Pope Francis



Synopsis

A down-to-earth and deeply intimate portrait of Pope Francis and his faith, based on interviews with the men and women who knew him simply as Jorge Mario Bergoglio Early on the evening of March 13, 2013, the newly elected Pope Francis stepped out onto the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica and did something remarkable: Before he imparted his blessing to the crowd, he asked the crowd to bless him, then bowed low to receive this grace. In the days that followed, Mark K. Shriver—along with the rest of the world—was astonished to see a pope who paid his own hotel bill, eschewed limousines, and made his home in a suite of austere rooms in a Vatican guesthouse rather than the grand papal apartment in the Apostolic Palace. By setting an example of humility and accessibility, Francis breathed new life into the Catholic Church, attracting the admiration of Catholics and non-Catholics alike. In *Pilgrimage*, Shriver retraces Francis's personal journey, revealing the origins of his open, unpretentious style and explaining how it revitalized Shriver's own faith and renewed his commitment to the Church. To help us understand how Jorge Mario Bergoglio became Pope Francis, Shriver travels to Bergoglio's native Argentina to meet with the people who knew him as a child, as a young Jesuit priest, and as a reformist bishop. Shriver visits the confessional where Bergoglio first felt called to a faith-based life and takes us to the humble parish where the future pontiff's pastoral career began: in a church created from a converted vegetable shed in an area just outside the city of Buenos Aires. In these impoverished surroundings, Bergoglio answered Christ's call to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, and shelter the homeless, following the example set by his papal namesake, St. Francis of Assisi. The remarkable personality and impact of Pope Francis is such that even a Jewish reader -- such as I -- instantly was intrigued by the prospect of learning more about what shaped this man and how he emerged from Argentina to become the Pope that he is. With an exemplary combination of in-depth reporting and personal reflection, Mark K. Shriver has done an outstanding job exploring the origins, influences, conflicts, and spiritual evolution that transformed Jorge Mario Bergoglio from a stern, pedantic Argentinian priest into the extraordinarily loving and inclusive Pope Francis who has captivated the world -- and also enriched and rejuvenated Shriver's own Catholic faith, which had faltered in the wake of the scandals that engulfed the Catholic Church in recent years. Shriver provides fascinating insights into the factors and experiences that have made Pope Francis a spiritual leader whose message leaps across religious, national and cultural boundaries in ways that seem as unprecedented as they are inspiring. As a veteran reporter and author myself (most recently of "The Special Field: A History of Neurosurgery at Johns Hopkins"), I was impressed by how Shriver conducted more than 100 interviews with people who have known the Pope over the past half-century, from clergymen to trash collectors. The interviews elicit anecdotes and observations that enable Shriver to unravel the mystery of how this pontiff came to be who he is. This book should be of interest to and prompt reflection by readers of any faith -- and even those with no religious affiliation.

Loved it! As a lifelong Catholic, I totally related to the author's disillusionment with the Church and desire for change. Pope Francis is like a breath of fresh air and I enjoyed learning more about him. Pilgrimage really gets at who he is as a person, not just the facts of his life. I enjoyed the interviews with his friends in Argentina, especially the two rabbis, the priests who work in the slums, and the garbage collector. The book is a journey and the author writes it in a way that allows the reader to come along with him. By the end, I too felt my faith in the Church had been restored. I highly recommend it!

This book is the fourth biography of Pope Francis that I have read. The key to me to understand Pope Francis was found on page 62. This chapter is on Bergoglio as a Jesuit novice. One of his students, Father Paredes said: "We got the sense that Zaragozi (the Jesuit novice master) awoke in Bergoglio not just the habit but the rage for prayer that he has to this day." Bingo, so that's his secret. Much of the rest of the book covered materials I had read before, but Mark Shriver gives this

material his own take. I found some other keen insights, but the one about Bergoglio, now Pope Francis, unlocked the Pope in a very profound way.

Was worried that this would be another book purchase I'd have a hard time wading through, given the "gravitas" of the subject. It's an easy, enlightening and enjoyable read. SO glad I bought it! Would recommend this for Catholics and non-Catholics alike.

The humility and the humanity of a genuinely charismatic figure (in both the literal and figurative sense) is revealed in the exploration of the life of Mario Bergoglio, now Pope Francis. In this work the humanity of the author is revealed as well. Rather than a recitation of the human flaws of the subject or the author, it is a narrative of the struggle that Bergoglio endured just as each of us endures as we attempt to negotiate our way through each day, serve ourselves and each other with a little grace, and try to leave our flock or our family or our world in a little better place. It is a book about the Catholic pope but not meant only for Catholics. Rather, in this time when social justice is at such a premium, it is a compelling description of how perhaps its chief proponent, now residing in Vatican City, came by such a circuitous route to this station. Mark Shriver's first book, *A Good Man*, was about his father, Sargent Shriver. The author has a superb voice to describe these fine men, cut from the same cloth.
