

I loved this book. I wasn't sure how I would like the Q&A format, but it turned out that it made for a great read for me. I couldn't put it down. I'm sure there are all sorts of books that get into the strategic role the SR-71 had in ending the Cold War, but this book is for aviation enthusiasts who want to know as much as can be disclosed about what it takes to become an SR-71 crew member, what it's like to fly this incredible feat of aviation engineering, and what life is like being a Habu. After reading the author's description of dealing with peculiarities such as inlet unstarts and flying as slowly as possible while being refueled by a KC-135 flying as fast as possible, it's amazing there weren't more mishaps. Additionally, I was heartened to see the adulation the author gives throughout the book to the large cast of mission planners and support personnel who prepared and maintained the SR-71. This is definitely not anything close to the type of airplane a pilot could simply jump in unassisted and fly around the field. I highly recommend this

book. My only complaint is its small size and the quality of reproduction of the photos. This book deserves to be a high-end coffee table book with the great photos printed to maximum quality.
